

MULTILIT Schoolwise program records best results ever

Program of MULTILIT instruction known as 'Schoolwise' has been provided by MULTILIT for the Exodus Foundation, the Ashfield-based charity, since 1996. A fresh cohort of older low-progress readers (Years 5 and 6) is admitted into the program for two terms (mornings only) each half year. The gains in reading skills recorded as a result of the program have been consistently excellent for the past 12 years.

The results of the 35 students completing the course in the first half year of 2008, however, have astonished even the project directors, Professor Kevin Wheldall and Dr Robyn Beaman.

"We had become almost a little complacent about the consistency of the impressive gains over the years," said Dr Beaman. "But we were astounded by the outstanding gains from this latest group of Schoolwise students."

All students are assessed on a battery of tests of reading and related skills at the beginning and then again, two terms (about five months) later, at the end of the program. Older low-progress readers like these would typically make only about two months' progress in two terms in their regular classes; many have stopped making any progress at all.

When they came to us, the students in the latest intake

were, on average, three and a half years behind what might typically be expected for their age in reading. After two terms of parttime instruction, the average reading and spelling performance for this group of students had increased, on average, by: 22 months in reading

accuracy and 18 months in reading comprehension; 16 months in single word recognition and 34 months (almost three years) in non-word reading (decoding); 19 months in spelling; and they could now read nearly 50% more words correctly per minute.

These excellent results mean that these students are going to be able to make far more sense of what they are asked to read in school, and thus be more capable of benefiting from their regular schooling.

MULTILIT Director wins top LD award

earning Difficulties Australia (LDA) has awarded Professor Kevin Wheldall, Chairman and Director of MULTILIT, the Mona Tobias Award for 2008. The Mona Tobias Award is an annual award presented by LDA "in recognition of an outstanding contribution to the field of learning difficulties in Australia. This contribution may be in the area of leadership, research, practice or teacher and community education."

The citation for the award reads as follows:

"In making this Award, the Judging Committee noted your significant contribution to the field of learning difficulties through your research and publications, particularly in the areas of classroom behaviour management and helping low progress readers. They noted particularly the success of your MULTILIT program, developed to assist low progress readers, and the significant impact that this has had in improving the performance of students with reading difficulties, particularly those from socially disadvantaged backgrounds. They also noted that you have recently received a substantial grant from the federal government to implement this program in a major project in Queensland, designed to improve the reading and related skills of aboriginal students in indigenous communities in Cape York. Your significant contribution in informing public

debate, particularly on issues relating to evidence-based practice and effective teaching of reading, and your contribution to academic publications through your editorship of both the Australian Journal of Learning Disabilities (now the Australian Journal of Learning Difficulties) and the international journal Educational Psychology was also acknowledged. Your membership of the Academy of Social Sciences in Australia and of the International Academy for Research in Learning Disabilities was seen as evidence of the recognition of your significant contribution to the field of education, particularly in the field of learning difficulties, by these prestigious organisations."

MULTILIT in India

he Parikrma Humanity Foundation in Bangalore, India is excited to trial the MULTILIT program in their centres for learning. We are a non-government organisation providing 970 street, slum and orphaned children with quality education, health care, nutrition and family care. We pride ourselves on giving our students the highest quality education available in India so that they can compete on equal terms. We are very excited to now incorporate the MULTILIT Reading Tutor Program as part of our curriculum; it will be available to students who are struggling to read. We believe that by empowering these students they too can achieve their goals and become selfsufficient, contributing members of society. We strongly believe that developing strong literacy skills is one of the key factors in our children reaching their potential.

The MULTILIT program has shown fantastic results in Australia and we are hoping that we too can achieve these results for our children, even though they are from a different cultural background. The MULTILIT team has supported us with training and resources, and this has given us the opportunity to trial the MULTILIT program across all of our centres for learning.

The concept of the MULTILIT program was introduced to the teaching staff of Parikrma on 2 June 2008. The response from the teachers was overwhelming - they all wanted to know more and be involved as tutors themselves. We then organised a team of local and international volunteers to become Parikrma's Literacy Tutors. These volunteers were trained in a one day workshop and were supported throughout their first week of tutoring by Parikrma's Special Educator, who was trained at the Macquarie University Special Education Centre (MUSEC) and attended the MULTILIT accreditation course.

After the MULTILIT training, the

volunteers were off to a fantastic start. The children have really enjoyed their sessions, and are very quick to run out of their class and find their MULTILIT tutor for sessions. The tutors have had to become a little creative in finding places to do their sessions. When you walk into the schools, you'll see MULTILIT sessions on the rooftop, in the food hall, in the computer room and in the classroom hallwavs. This has not fazed our tutors or our students, as the students get very excited when they pass their MULTILIT levels and are thrilled with the tutors' constant praise and enthusiasm.

Many students at Parikrma need to participate in the MULTILIT program, but due to lack of resources and volunteers, only 120 children have been able to participate at this time. We hope the partnership between MULTILIT and Parikrma can strengthen for many years to come. We are truly grateful for the time, energy and support we have received from MULTILIT.

The appreciation is shared by our children who have given us fantastic feedback such as:

"I am a very good reader, because I passed my level, right?"

News from the MULTILIT Training Team

2008 has been an exciting and busy year for the MULTILIT Training Team. It has become increasingly apparent that the availability of high quality training to ensure effective delivery of the MULTILIT Reading Tutor Program is key to its success. To achieve this, MULTILIT has offered many more workshops than in the past and has expanded into other Australian capital cities, regional areas and even New Zealand. Since the launch of the revised Reading Tutor Program late last year, over 400 teachers and paraprofessional staff have attended the revamped one-day workshop. The workshop enables participants to gain an overview of MULTILIT and look closely at each of the three strands of the program

through practical demonstration and exercises. By the end of the day, each teacher has the tools to set up the program in their school with confidence.

The three-day accreditation course developed and introduced this year has got off to a good start. Licensees are required to do the course but it is also open to teachers in schools who would like to gain a greater understanding of the program and includes some training on Positive Teaching, additional intervention strategies and monitoring and data collection. Four accreditation courses have been held this year. MULTILIT is looking forward to training a growing body of accredited practitioners and licensees who are then able to offer low progress readers the instruction they need but very often can't access.

MULTILIT has conducted several on-site consultancies this year. If a school or cluster of schools would like training in the MULTILIT Reading Tutor Program, it is often more costeffective to train a group this way. A consultancy also allows the training to be flexible and tailor-made to the school.
