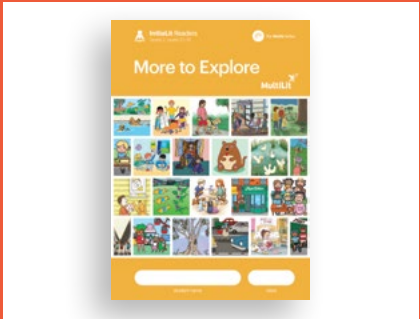

Choosing the right program

identifying student needs

MultiLit has developed a suite of evidence-based literacy programs designed to ensure every child can learn to read and spell. Depending on the specific needs of schools and students, a range of programs may be required across year groups to deliver effective and comprehensive literacy instruction.

When choosing programs from MultiLit, consider:

- student needs, using a Response to Intervention framework
- student ages and stage at school
- whole-class and intervention programs.

What is the Response to Intervention framework (RtI)?

RtI is a model of instructional support where students are provided with increasingly intensive levels of assistance depending on their rate of progress. MultiLit's programs and assessments are designed for use within a Response to Intervention (RtI) framework.

How does RtI help?

The RtI approach ensures that struggling students are identified early, given appropriate support to suit their needs and monitored regularly. It categorises instructional needs into tiers.

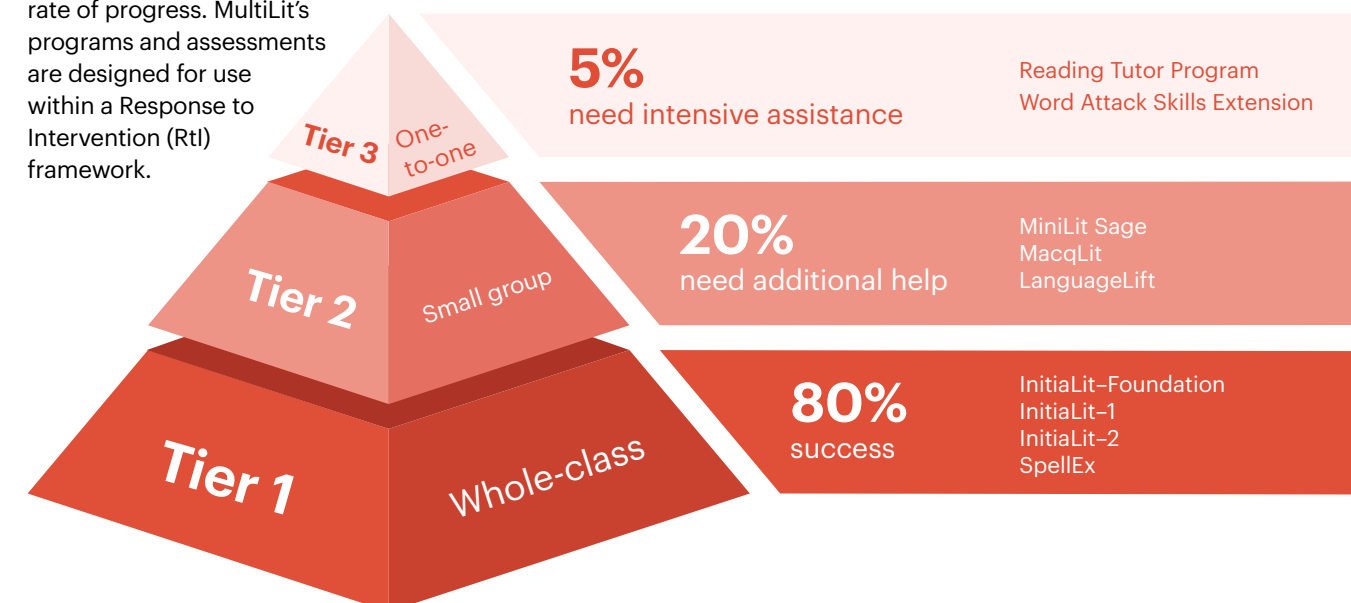
What are the RtI tiers?

Tier 1 instruction: Most students (up to 80%) are able to learn successfully within a whole-class program, provided the instruction is excellent.

Tier 2 instruction: For those students who need extra help (up to 20%), more intensive instruction in small groups may be necessary.

Tier 3 instruction: For students who do not make sufficient progress at Tier 2, more targeted, frequent and intensive instruction should be considered. Approximately 5% of students will require one-to-one help, provided by specialist teachers.

The RtI tier structure enables schools to easily identify which programs are best suited for learners' needs.

Why choose a whole-class program?

Effective whole-class instruction ensures consistency across year groups and reduces the number of children requiring literacy support in higher grades. Assessments built into MultiLit's whole-class programs help teachers identify which students are not making progress very early on and take steps to provide extra support. MultiLit strongly recommends adopting InitialLit, a whole-class literacy program (Tier 1), in the early years of schooling.

Why choose an intervention program?

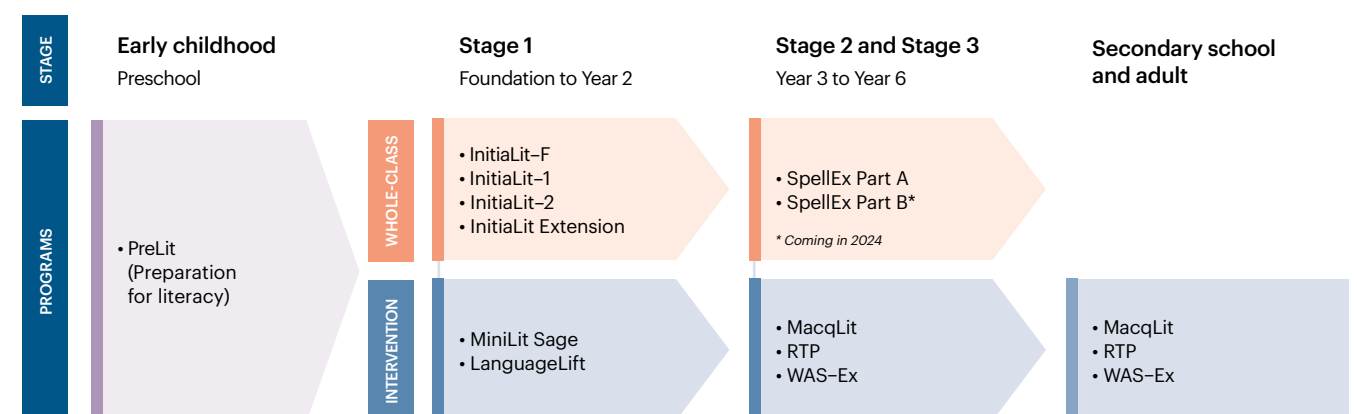
Even with effective whole-class instruction, around 20% of students will require additional, more intensive support (Tiers 2 and 3). Intervention is essential to ensure struggling students receive the help they need and is much more effective if put in place early. MultiLit intervention programs are available for students requiring help with oral language skills, essential for literacy, as well as reading support from Foundation through to secondary school.

Importance of the MultiLit Research Unit

The highly regarded MultiLit Research Unit (MRU), with its team of nine PhD qualified researchers, is at the heart of MultiLit's approach to innovation and development. The MRU carries out research underpinning the programs and services provided by MultiLit and evaluates the efficacy of MultiLit classroom resources.

Decades of experience and expertise

The MRU was founded when MultiLit Pty Ltd was established as an independent entity in 2006, building on the major research initiative previously undertaken within the Macquarie University Special Education Centre (MUSEC).

The depth of knowledge and expertise within the MRU is distinctive in the educational landscape, and gives schools confidence that they are accessing the best translation of research into practice.

Evaluating program success

Every MultiLit program is rigorously trialled and tested in Australian classrooms to gain valuable feedback from teachers and assess the effectiveness of instruction. Trial results are published in the program manual.

MultiLit's development cycle

MultiLit's academically informed, multi-stage product development means schools can be assured of quality and effectiveness.

Working collaboratively, MultiLit's expert Product Development team and the MRU take new programs from initial concept, to development and trialling, right through to publication and implementation.

The MultiLit development cycle comprises eight key components:



Research rationale developed: The key science behind the proposed program is summarised to inform the program development.

Prototype created: A prototype program is developed following the scope and sequence.

Field trial conducted: The prototype program is tested in a small number of schools and field trial data is collected.

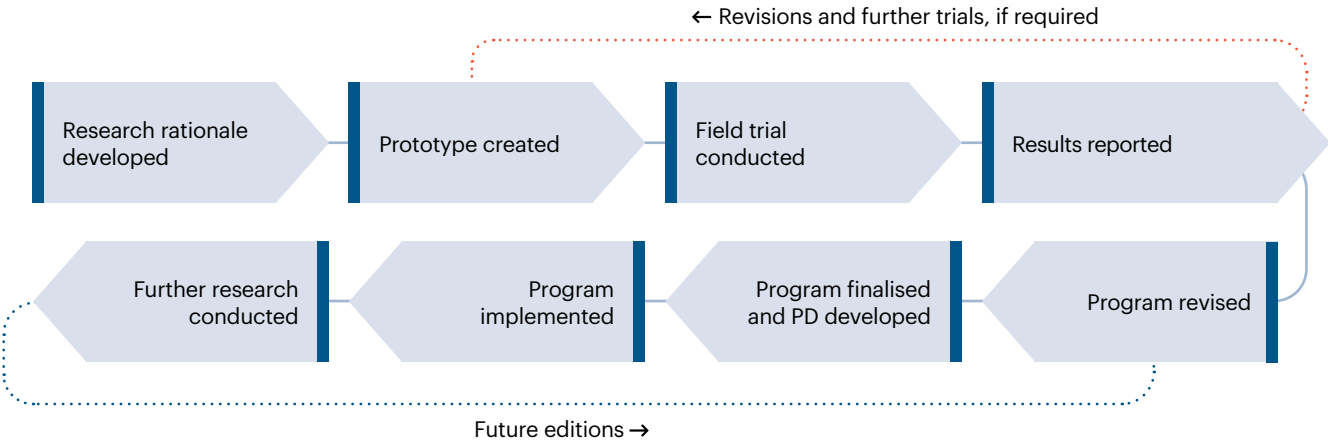
Results reported: The results of the trial are assessed to determine if the program is effective in achieving identified education outcomes.

Program revised: A detailed review of the program is conducted with revisions incorporated based on field trial results and school feedback.

Program finalised and PD developed: The program is finalised for publication and PD workshops are created.

Program implemented: The program is published for schools and PD commences.

Further research conducted: Wider research trials may be conducted and published, with results incorporated into further editions of MultiLit programs.

PreLit lays a solid foundation upon which children learn to read. It equips educators with the tools to teach pre-literacy skills and concepts. A systematic, skills-based program, it focuses on phonological awareness and oral language development.

Enjoyable and engaging, PreLit is designed to complement a play-based learning environment. It also helps provide a smooth transition to school.

This program is ideal for preschools, day care and early learning centres looking to teach pre-literacy skills effectively. It follows the preferred method of intentional teaching for the Early Years Learning Framework for Australia.



What it covers

PreLit is taught in a hierarchical skills sequence through 108 short, clearly prescribed lessons that incorporate the teaching of essential phonological awareness activities. The lessons are followed by Shared Storybook Reading to develop vocabulary and oral language.

The program teaches children the concepts of phonological awareness (such as words, syllables, rhyme and phonemes) as well as print awareness (such as printed words and letter awareness) before they start school.

InitialLit is an evidence-based, whole-class literacy program which encompasses InitialLit–Foundation (InitialLit–F), InitialLit–1 and InitialLit–2. This three-year program provides all children with the essential core knowledge and strong foundations to become successful readers and writers. InitialLit provides consistent instruction across year groups and reduces the number of students needing literacy support in higher grades.

Ideal for students in the first three years of school, InitialLit provides a comprehensive reading and spelling program. It utilises a synthetic phonics approach alongside a rich literature and vocabulary component that is aligned with the Australian Curriculum.



What it covers

InitialLit's holistic approach covers systematic synthetic phonics, phonemic awareness, fluency, vocabulary and comprehension (The Five Big Ideas) and follows a structured scope and sequence. Professional development

Professional development in InitialLit is essential for successful program implementation. There is a compulsory two-day PD workshop which covers InitialLit–F, InitialLit–1 and InitialLit–2 that must be completed prior to implementation of the InitialLit program. This PD can be undertaken face-to-face or via videoconference. Bookings for on-request workshops for your school are also available.

The PD workshop covers:

- the theoretical and research framework on which InitialLit is based
- a detailed overview of program content
- implementation and assessment procedures
- practical demonstrations of lessons and opportunities to practise lesson delivery.

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We spent the best part of a year evaluating and researching approaches to teaching literacy. InitialLit–Foundation (InitialLit–F) offers an effective model for teaching reading and related skills to children in their first year of schooling in an enjoyable and engaging way. It is the first year of a three-year program and utilises a systematic synthetic phonics approach.

The program incorporates daily lessons in phonemic awareness, reading and spelling, as well as rich language instruction using children’s literature.

Two series of InitialLit Readers (Levels 1–9) align to the instructional sequence. These decodable readers are highly recommended to accompany the program, enabling children to generalise and consolidate their skills.



What it covers

Aligned with the Australian Curriculum, InitialLit–F comprises two components:

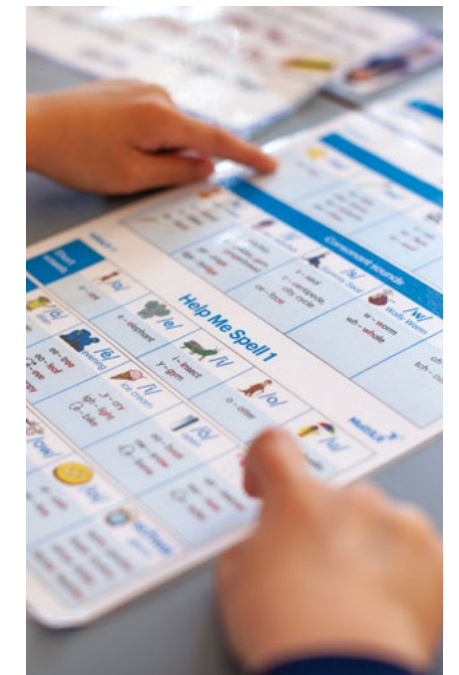
- The explicit and systematic synthetic phonics component teaches letter–sound correspondences and how to apply this knowledge to reading and spelling.
- The literature component enriches oral language, vocabulary and listening comprehension through Storybook lessons using quality children’s literature.



How it is delivered

InitialLit–F is designed to be delivered in a 90-minute instruction block. It should take place four to five times a week. There are 126 lessons which are spread across the year:

- 20–25 minutes whole-class teaching using a scripted lesson
- 30–45 minutes further literacy work to consolidate and practise skills
- 15–20 minutes Storybook session
- progress monitoring using curriculum-based assessments to identify student needs.



InitialLit-1



InitialLit-1 continues from InitialLit-F, providing whole-class literacy instruction for students in their second year of schooling. It follows a similar structure to InitialLit-F with scripted lessons followed by independent and teacher-led work.

InitialLit-1 includes daily lessons in reading and spelling, as well as rich language and vocabulary instruction using children’s literature. To align with the instructional sequence, decodable InitialLit Readers (Levels 10–16) have been developed to help students generalise and consolidate their skills.

Over the course of the year, students will complete the advanced alphabetic code, learn basic spelling conventions and morphemes, and be introduced to some grammatical concepts. There is also a growing focus on reading fluency and comprehension as children’s decoding becomes more confident.



What it covers

InitialLit-1 has two main components:

- The phonics component systematically teaches the advanced alphabetic code in a set sequence. This includes letter-sound correspondences and their application to reading and spelling, as well as common morphemes and simple grammatical concepts.
- The vocabulary, oral language and comprehension component is taught using quality children’s literature. There are 25 Storybook titles that have been selected for use with the program.



How it is delivered

- InitialLit-1 is designed to be delivered in a 90-minute instruction block. It should take place four to five times a week. There are 131 lessons which are spread across the year:
- 25–30 minutes whole-class teaching using a scripted lesson plan, covering reading and spelling
 - 30–40 minutes small group and independent work
 - 15–20 minutes Storybook session
 - progress monitoring using curriculum-based assessments to identify student needs.

InitialLit has been an amazing program which has not only benefitted my students, but myself as a first-year graduate. With a class of 30 students, the program has been instrumental in enabling me to provide lessons aimed at engaging and targeting all ability levels. InitialLit-2



By Year 2, most students will be well on their way to reading independence. InitialLit-2 works to consolidate reading and spelling skills, with a specific focus on reading comprehension, fluency, spelling and vocabulary.

Over the course of the year, students will revise phonic spelling patterns and learn several new patterns and rules. Seven useful comprehension strategies to apply to text and key grammar concepts are explicitly taught. Focused writing tasks help to consolidate these concepts.

The Storybook component provides opportunities to learn new and interesting vocabulary. InitialLit-2 encourages children to look at new words in depth and use the words in oral language and writing. Writing lessons introduce text structure and different types of text.



What it covers

InitialLit-2 comprises four main components:

- The spelling component teaches grapheme-phoneme correspondences and spelling concepts. It teaches the remainder of the advanced alphabetic code as well as new spelling rules and morphological concepts.
- In the reading comprehension and fluency component, students are taught comprehension strategies and how to apply them to different types of text. Reading fluency is practised through echo, choral and paired reading.
- The grammar component explicitly teaches key grammatical features and how to apply them to a writing task.
- The vocabulary, oral language and listening comprehension component is taught through children’s literature. Detailed lessons are provided for each of the 15 Storybook titles selected, including writing tasks. Two novel studies are included for use towards the end of the year.



How it is delivered

- InitialLit-2 is designed to be delivered five times a week:
- 40-minute comprehension and fluency lessons 2 x per week
 - 20–30-minute spelling lessons 3 x per week
 - 30-minute Storybook lessons 2 x per week
 - grammar lessons (to be used flexibly during writing lessons)
 - use of RAD Reading Book for reading groups
 - activities for independent work
 - progress monitoring using curriculum-based assessments to identify student needs.

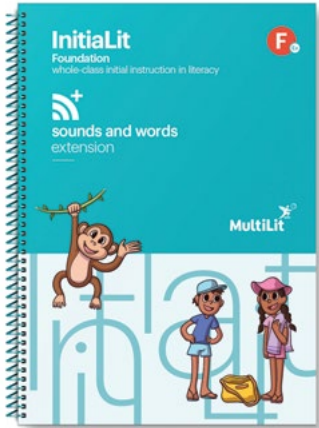
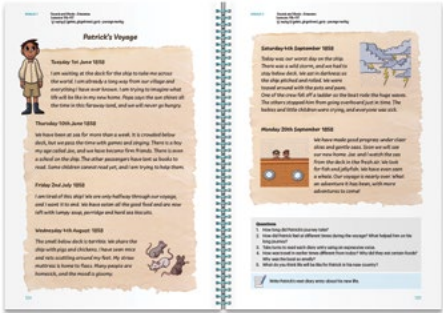

SpellEx is a new, comprehensive, whole-class spelling program designed to help students make the right decisions when spelling words. Strong spelling skills are important for reading and writing and benefit all curriculum areas.

The program's carefully scripted lessons ensure students are taught the skills and knowledge required to master English orthography using a language-based approach.

SpellEx Part A, released in 2023, is suitable for students from Year 3. It provides explicit instruction in the three key areas of spelling: phonology, orthography and morphology. Part B, for students from Year 4, is scheduled for release in late 2024.

What it covers

SpellEx grows and consolidates students' phonological, orthographic and morphological knowledge through 105 scripted lessons and is designed to be delivered over four terms. Incorporating findings from recent research, students will work with words beyond the level of grapheme-phoneme correspondences, leading to a much deeper understanding of the English spelling system.

Language comprehension is foundational to the understanding of written text. It is also important in its own right as language difficulties can limit classroom and social participation.

The WSCS is a test designed to identify young students who may require targeted language comprehension assessment and/or support. It also identifies students who may benefit from MultiLit's oral language skills program LanguageLift.

Wheldall Assessment of Reading Nonwords (WARN)

For beginners, reading depends largely on how well they can decode unfamiliar words. However, there are few tests that measure phonological recoding – or nonword reading – satisfactorily in the early years, and far fewer that measure fluency and allow for regular monitoring.

The WARN is brief and straightforward to administer and score. It is timed so that it measures reading fluency and not just accuracy, and is associated with valid and reliable Australian performance benchmarks.



How it works

The WARN comprises three Initial Assessment Lists and 10 Progress Monitoring Lists.

- Initial Assessment Lists can be used for screening, one-off assessment or monitoring progress over a longer period.

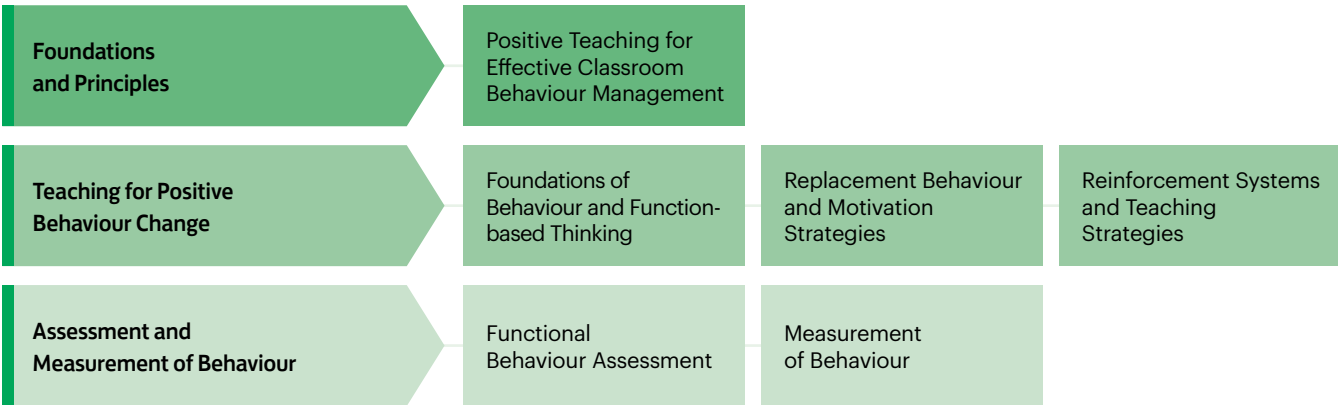
