Ensure your students become excellent spellers by giving them a solid understanding of the English spelling system, using SpellEx from MultiLit.

By growing and consolidating their phonological, orthographic and morphological knowledge, SpellEx helps students make the right decisions when choosing how to spell words. This will benefit their writing in all curriculum areas.

What is SpellEx?

SpellEx is a whole-class spelling program suitable for students from Year 3 (Part A) and Year 4 (Part B). It provides explicit instruction in spelling concepts, terminology, rules and conventions.

By following SpellEx's carefully scripted lessons, supported by a range of additional resources, teachers can be confident they are covering all the skills and knowledge required to master English orthography.

Stella the Super Speller and Eddy the Editor, who feature across the program, take students on an enlightening and enjoyable journey, as they become better spellers.

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Who is it for?

- SpellEx is a Tier 1 program within a Response to Intervention model, designed to be delivered to whole classes by classroom teachers
- Part A is for students from Year 3, but it can also be used by older students who have gaps in their spelling knowledge.
- Part B follows on from Part A and is for students in Year
 4. It can also be used by older students who have gaps in their spelling knowledge.





Is it evidence-based?

Recent research suggests that learning to spell involves drawing on phonological, orthographic and morphological knowledge simultaneously. Instruction is needed in these three key areas of language from the start. This theory is known as Triple Word Form Theory (Daffern, 2017) and has been used to guide the development of SpellEx. This means that students will work with words beyond the level of phoneme-grapheme correspondences, leading to a much deeper understanding of the English spelling system.

The SpellEx approach

SpellEx provides explicit whole-class lessons and a range of supporting resources to teach students about spelling. The program follows a scope and sequence that builds on skills taught in earlier years and aligns with the National Curriculum. Regular progress monitoring enables teachers to identify which students need more support and which students may need extending. There are opportunities for differentiation built into the program through small-group work and other activities.





Program content and resources

SpellEx Part A and Part B each include 105 lessons to be delivered over four terms, in three lessons per week. Each whole-class lesson is approximately 30 minutes, with additional time needed for further practice.

Each program includes:

- 105 fully scripted lessons to be delivered alongside slides and spelling workbooks (one per semester)
- Independent practice pages in the workbooks O
- C Explicit instruction in the spelling of tricky/useful words
- A variety of differentiated resources used for further C practice
- Support and extension mini lessons for differentiation
- 0 Review activities embedded in every lesson, with additional revision lessons timetabled throughout the program
- Top-Up lessons to be used flexibly in response to students' needs
- Fortnightly Progress Monitoring tests to O guide instruction
- Termly Cumulative Reviews to assess mastery of a larger set of skills
- A class record spreadsheet to record results C

By providing clear, easy-to-follow lessons and supporting resources, SpellEx not only saves preparation time, but also gives teachers the confidence to deliver exemplary lessons.



Professional development

To ensure schools gain maximum benefit from the program, a compulsory one-day professional development (PD) workshop must be attended when the program is first purchased.

- Guidance on the keys to successful delivery
- An explanation of the different types of assessments available in SpellEx which are used to monitor student progress, and make instructional decisions for the class and individual students
